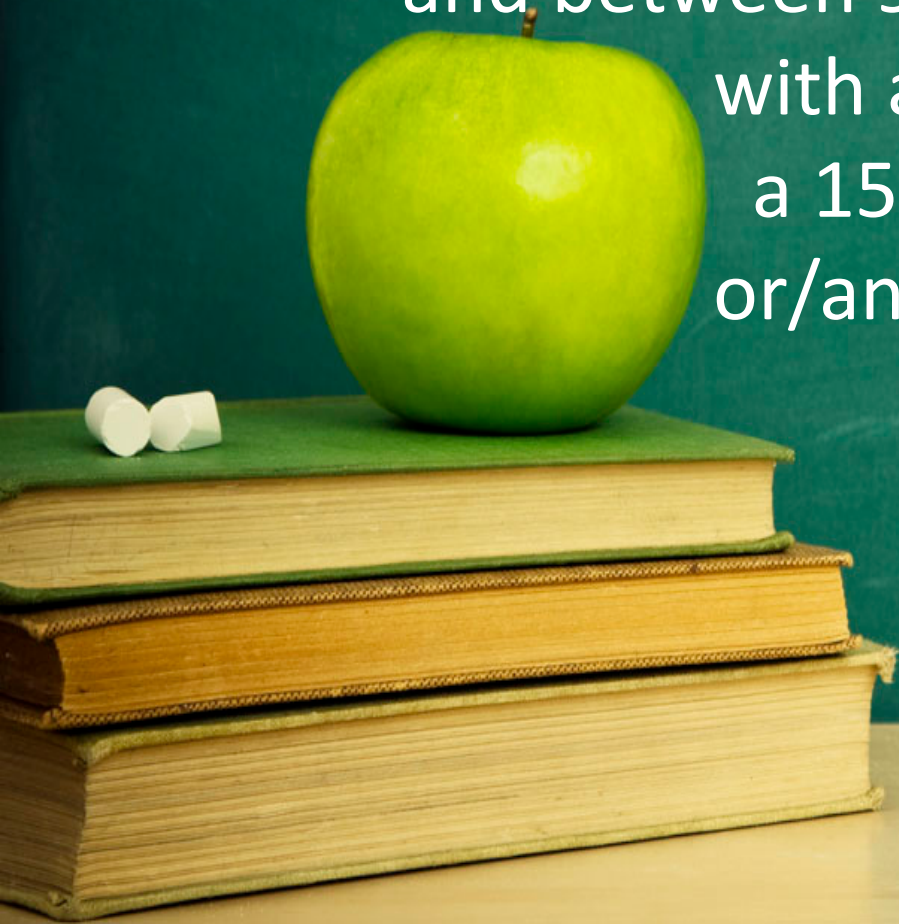
Subjects

Holidays and Terms

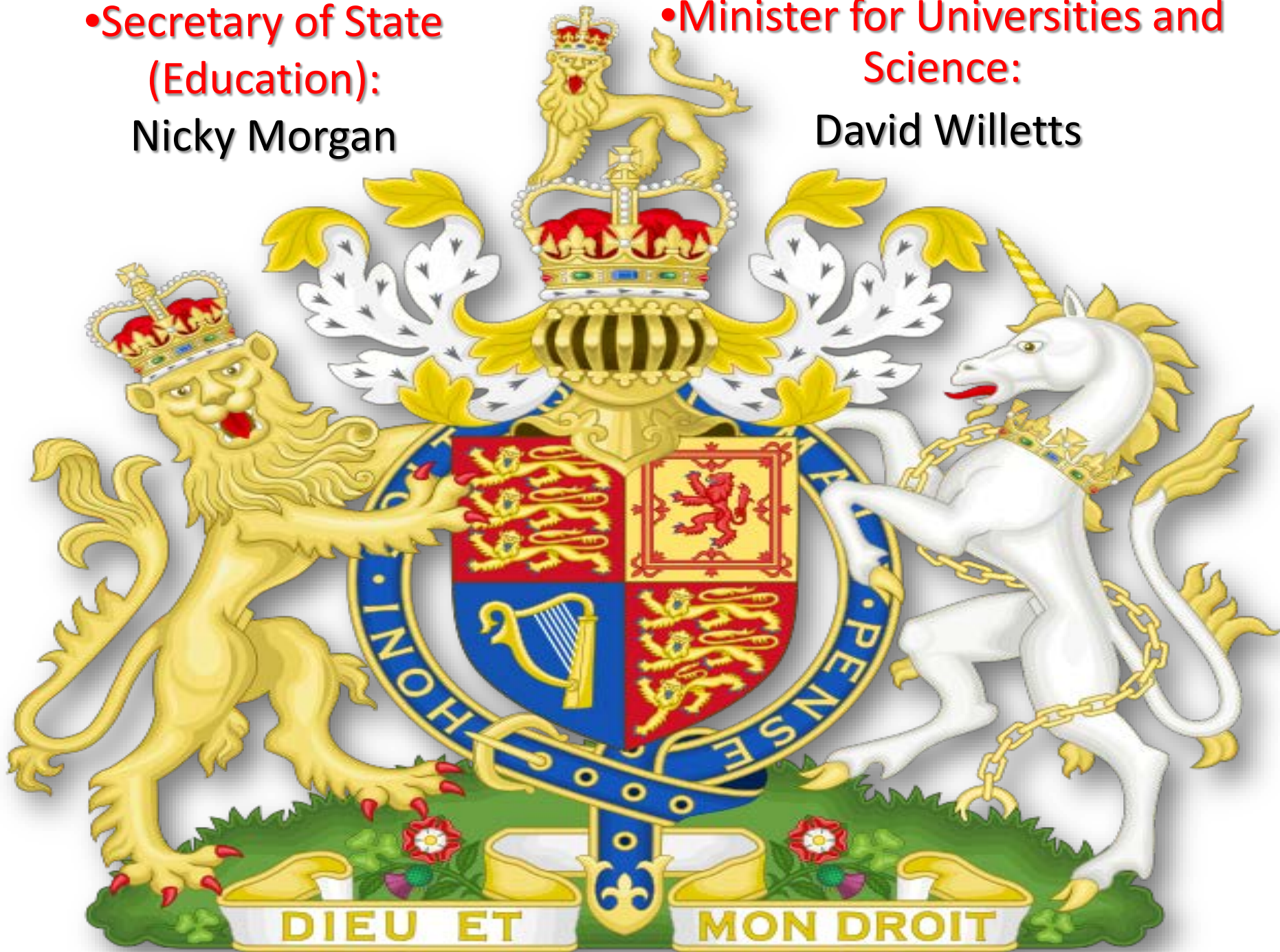
The school year begins at the beginning of September and consist of 3 terms, each with a week half-term break in the middle.
