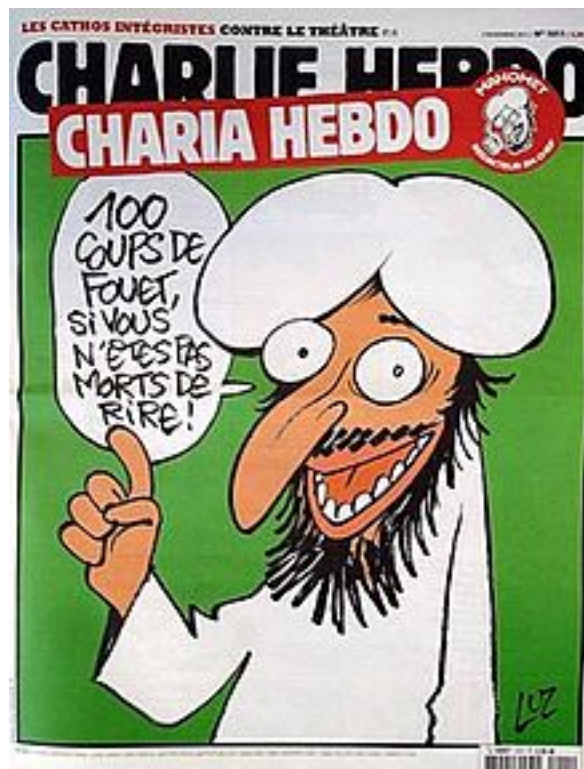


“ Je suis Charlie”

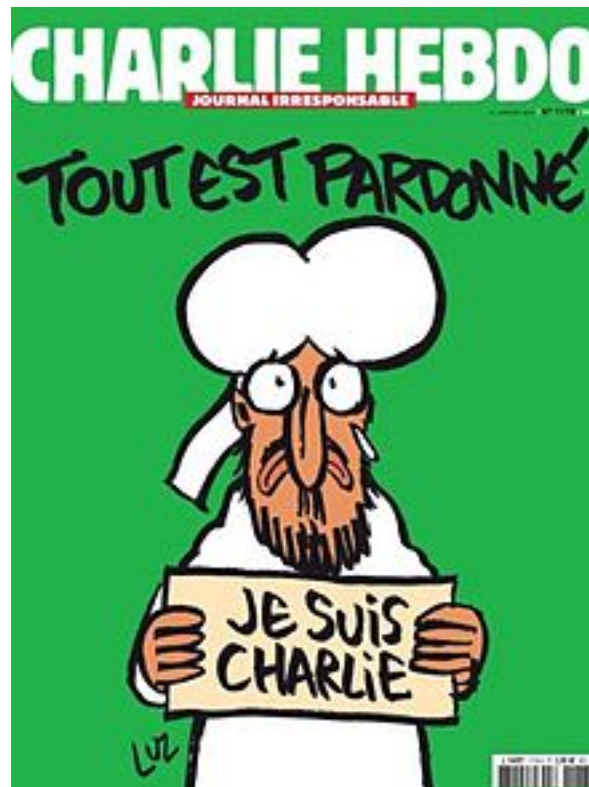
- Image of the 3 November 2011 cover of *Charlie Hebdo*. The word bubble reads "100 lashes if you don't die of laughter!"
