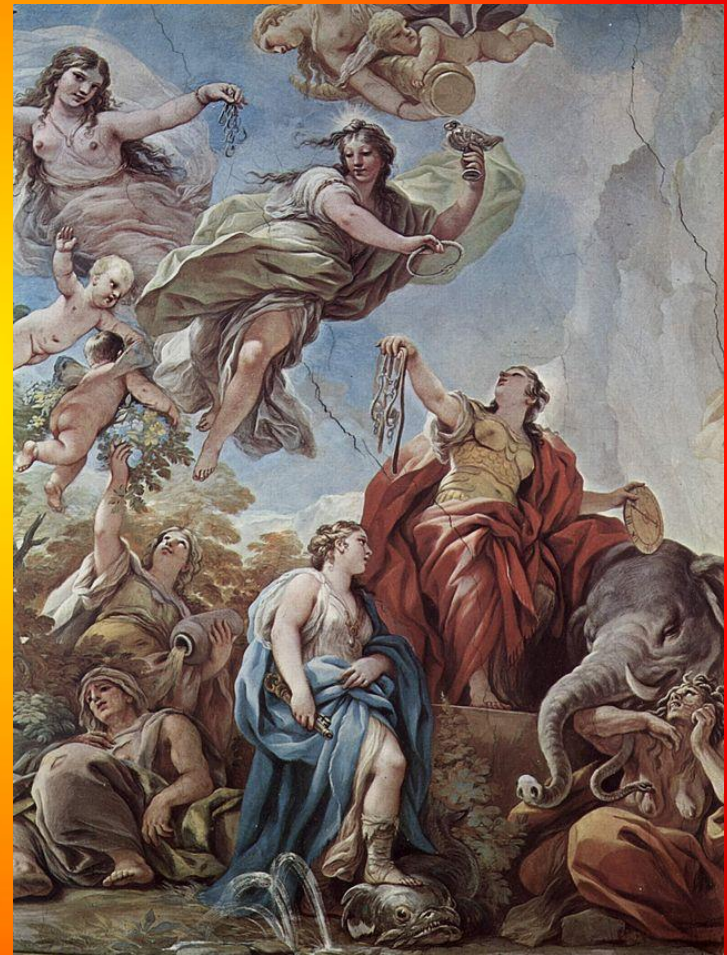
CHASTITY

❖ **Chastity** is sexual behavior of a man or woman that is acceptable to the moral standards of their culture, civilization or religion.



TEMPERANCE

- ❖ Restraint, temperance, justice. Constant mindfulness of others and one's surroundings; practicing self-control, abstinence and moderation.



GLUTTONY



- ❖ **Gluttony** means over-consumption of food, drink, or wealth items to the point of extravagance or waste.

CHARITY

- ❖ In Christian theology **Charity** is understood as "the friendship of man for God", which "unites us to God". It is claimed to be "the most excellent of the virtues".



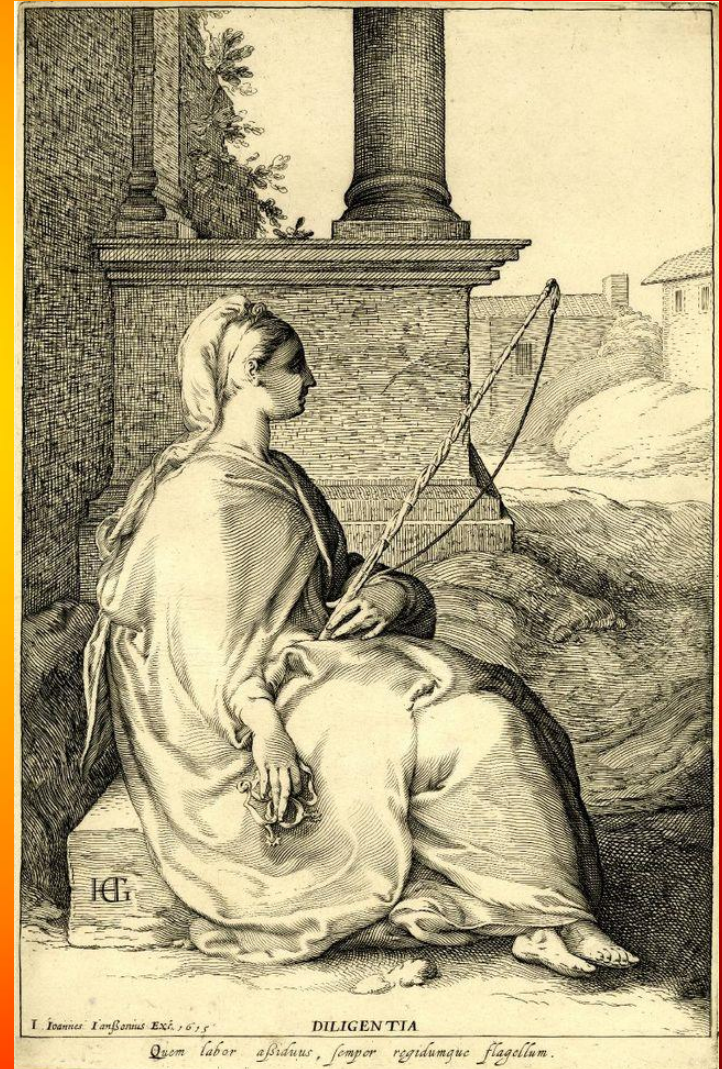
GREED



- ❖ **Greed** is like lust and gluttony, a sin of excess. However, greed is applied to a very excessive or rapacious desire and pursuit of material possessions.

DILIGENCE

- **Diligence** is the virtue of hard work. It is one of the seven heavenly virtues. Diligent behavior is indicative of work ethics; a belief that work is good in itself.



SLOTH



❖ **Sloth** is defined as spiritual or emotional apathy. It can also be either an outright refusal or merely a carelessness in one's obligations, especially spiritual, moral or legal responsibilities.

PATIENCE

❖ **Patience** is the state of endurance under difficult circumstances, which can mean persevering in the face of delay or provocation without acting on annoyance.



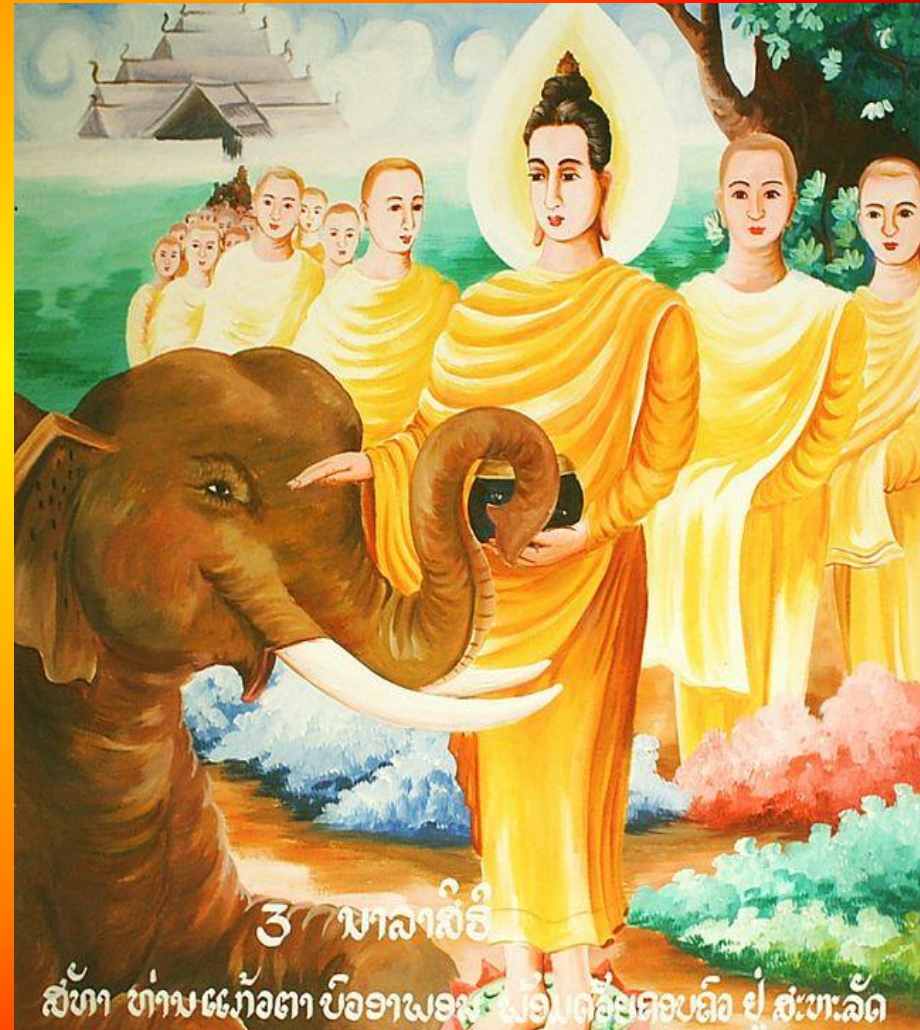
ANGER OR WRATH



- ❖ Saint Basil viewed **anger** as a "reprehensible temporary madness." Joseph F. Delany in the Catholic Encyclopedia (1914) defines **anger** as "the desire of vengeance" and states that a reasonable vengeance and passion is ethical.

KINDNESS

❖ **Kindness** is a behavior marked by ethical characteristic and concern for others. It is known as a virtue, and recognized as a value in many cultures and religions.



ENVY



- **Envy** is an emotion which “occurs when a person lacks another's superior quality or possession and wishes that the other lacked it”.

HUMILITY



❖ **Humility** is variously seen as the act or posture of lowering oneself in relation to others, having a clear perspective and respect for one's place in context.

PRIDE

❖ **Pride** is an emotion that carries two common meanings. With a negative connotation, **pride** refers to a sense of one's personal status or accomplishments, often used synonymously with hubris.
