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Hippies



- The hippie movement began as a youth movement in the United States during the early 1960s and then developed around the world.
- Its philosophy included harmony with nature, communal living and artistic experimentation, particularly in music.
- Hippies criticized middle class values, opposed nuclear weapons and the Vietnam War, embraced aspects of Eastern philosophy, were often vegetarian and eco-friendly.

Hippies

- They used alternative arts, street theatre, folk music, and psychedelic rock as part of their lifestyle and as a way of expressing their feelings, their protests and their vision of the world and life.
- Hippie fashion and values had a major effect on culture, influencing popular music, television, film, literature, and the arts.
- Hippies accepted religious and cultural differences and Eastern philosophy has reached more people.

Hippie Fashion

- Both men and women in the hippie movement wore jeans, had long hair and wore sandals or went barefoot.
- Men often wore beards, while women wore little or no makeup.
- Hippies often chose brightly coloured clothing and wore unusual styles, such as bell-bottom trousers and long, full skirts. Native American, Asian, Indian, African and Latin American motifs were also popular in hippies clothing.



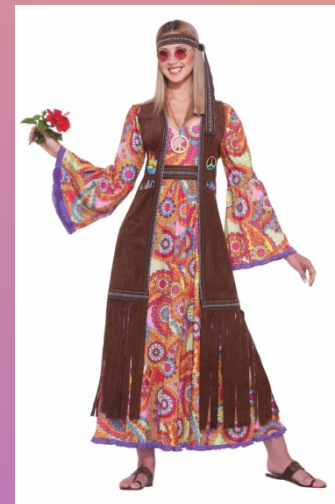
Hippie Fashion

- Many hippie clothes were self-made and hippies often purchased their clothes from second-hand shops.
- Favoured accessories for both men and women included Native American jewellery, head scarves, headbands and long necklaces.
- Hippie homes and vehicles were often decorated with psychedelic art.



Hippie Fashion

- The bold colours, hand-made clothing and loose fitting clothes opposed the tight and uniform clothing of the 1940s and 1950s.
- Hippies preferred hand-production of clothing.
