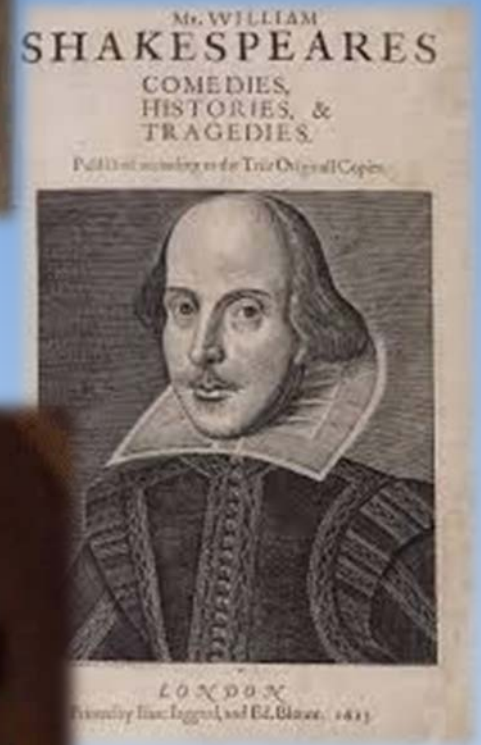
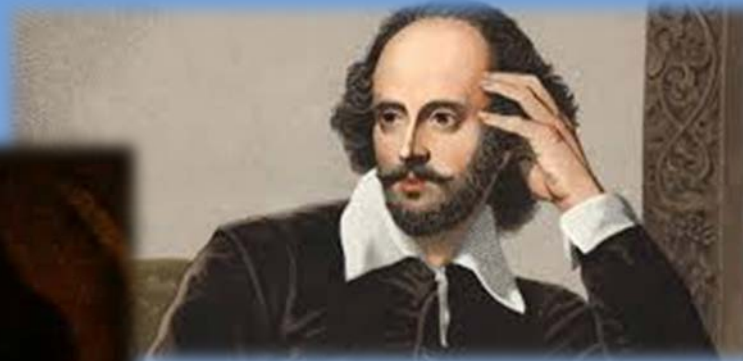

# **Shakespeare lives through Theatre**

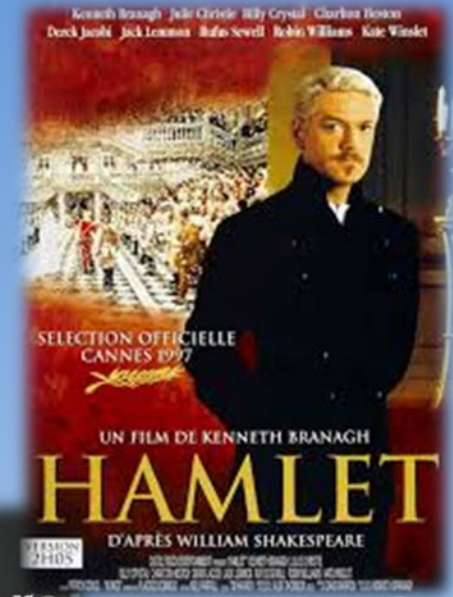

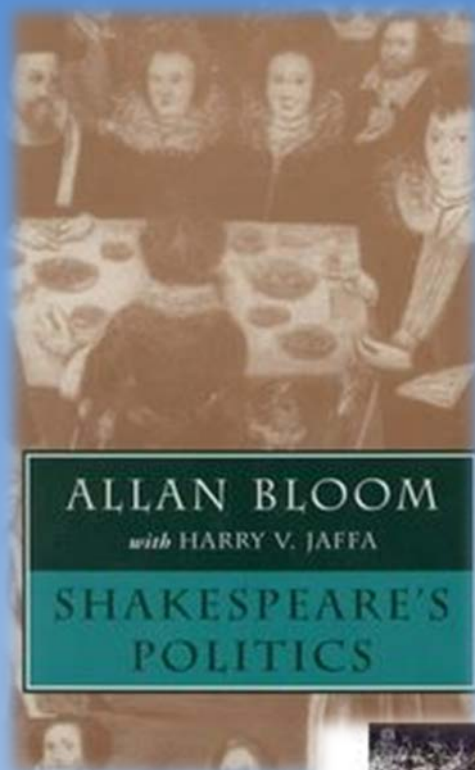

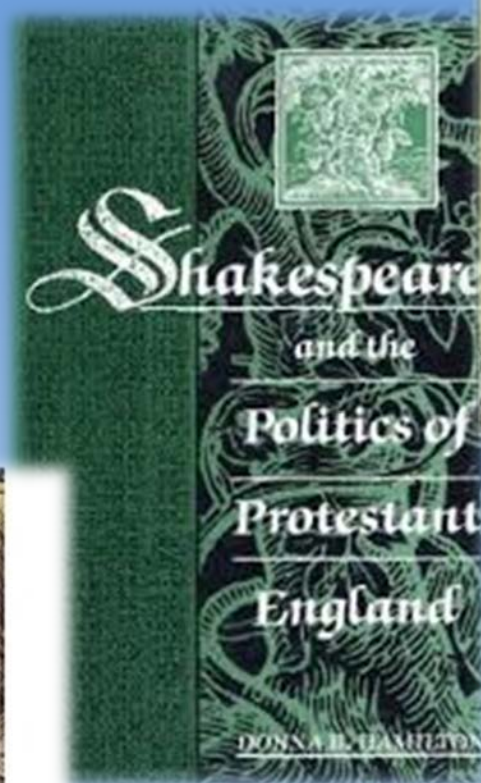

# **Shakespeare lives through Politics**

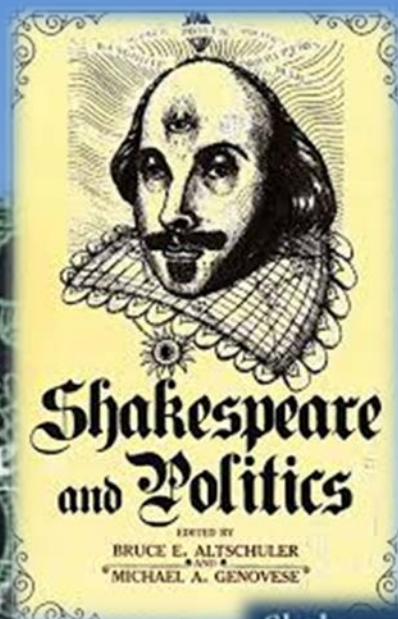

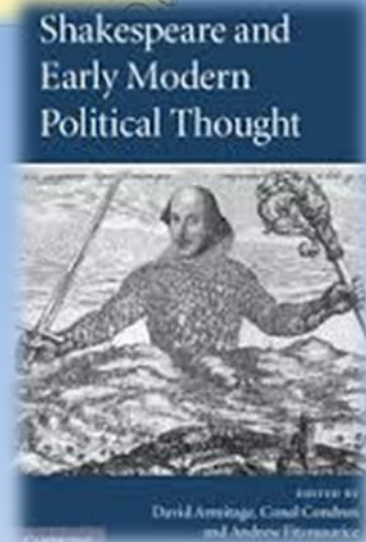
