Tourist attractions

There are many tourist attractions in Swansea like museums and historical buildings. Some of them old, some of them new, some of them big, some of them small.

National Waterfront Museum

The National Waterfront museum is part of the National museum of Wales and it opened in 2005. It includes the history of the Industrial Revolution and there you can see some of the machines used during that period.



Swansea museum

The Swansea museum is the oldest museum in Wales and it was built in 1841. It was built by the royal institution and it includes artistic and scientific exhibits.



Dylan Thomas Centre

The Dylan Thomas Center was built in 1825 as the city's Guildhall. In 1995, it was restored and now it is used as an arts center and it is also dedicated to the life and work of Dylan Thomas, a Welsh writer.



Liberty Stadium

The Liberty stadium is the stadium of Swansea A.F.C. and the rugby club Ospreys. The capacity of the stadium is 20.500 people. It also hosts some international games of Wales and some concerts like the ones of Elton John in 2008, Kings of Leon in 2014, and The Who in 2007.
