Location:

- ↳ Located on the south coast of England, the city of Brighton is the largest city on the English Channel coast and the third largest city in the south of England, after London and Bristol.



21st century:

- ↳ Brighton has been recognised as one of the most creative and appealing cities in Europe. New developments are popping up across the city all the time. In 2000, the city of Brighton and Hove started turning into a funky, cosmopolitan magnet for visitors of all types and ages. Right now the Brighton i360, an 183 metre high observation tower, designed by the architects behind the London Eye is being constructed on the seafront of Brighton, near the West Pier.

Eastbourne is located immediately east of Beachy Head, the highest chalk sea cliff in Great Britain and part of the South Downs National Park. Beachy head is infamous because it is considered an easy place to commit suicide. Eastbourne is about 1 and a half hours by train from London. Its shelter position next to the South Downs National Park contributes to it being known as the sunniest place in great Britain.
