Royal pavilion



The Royal pavilion or the Brighton pavilion was built in three stages, beginning in 1787, as a seaside retreat for George, prince of Wales, who became the prince regent in 1811. It was built in the Indo-Saracenic style, in India for most of the 19th century. The current appearance of the Pavilion is the work of the architect John Nash, who extended the building starting in 1815.

Brighton Wheel



The Brighton Wheel, also known as Brighton O, is a transportable wheel, which was moved from south Africa to England. Its operator claims that it can be disassembled and removed in two weeks.

There are 35 gondolas and each one of them can carry up to six adults and two children.
