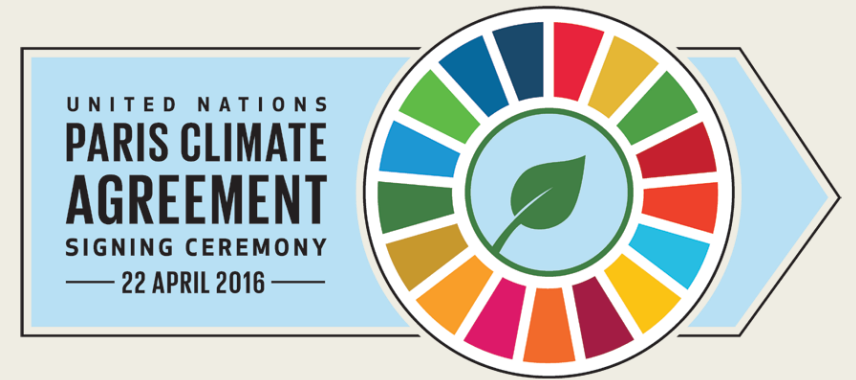

# Basic information

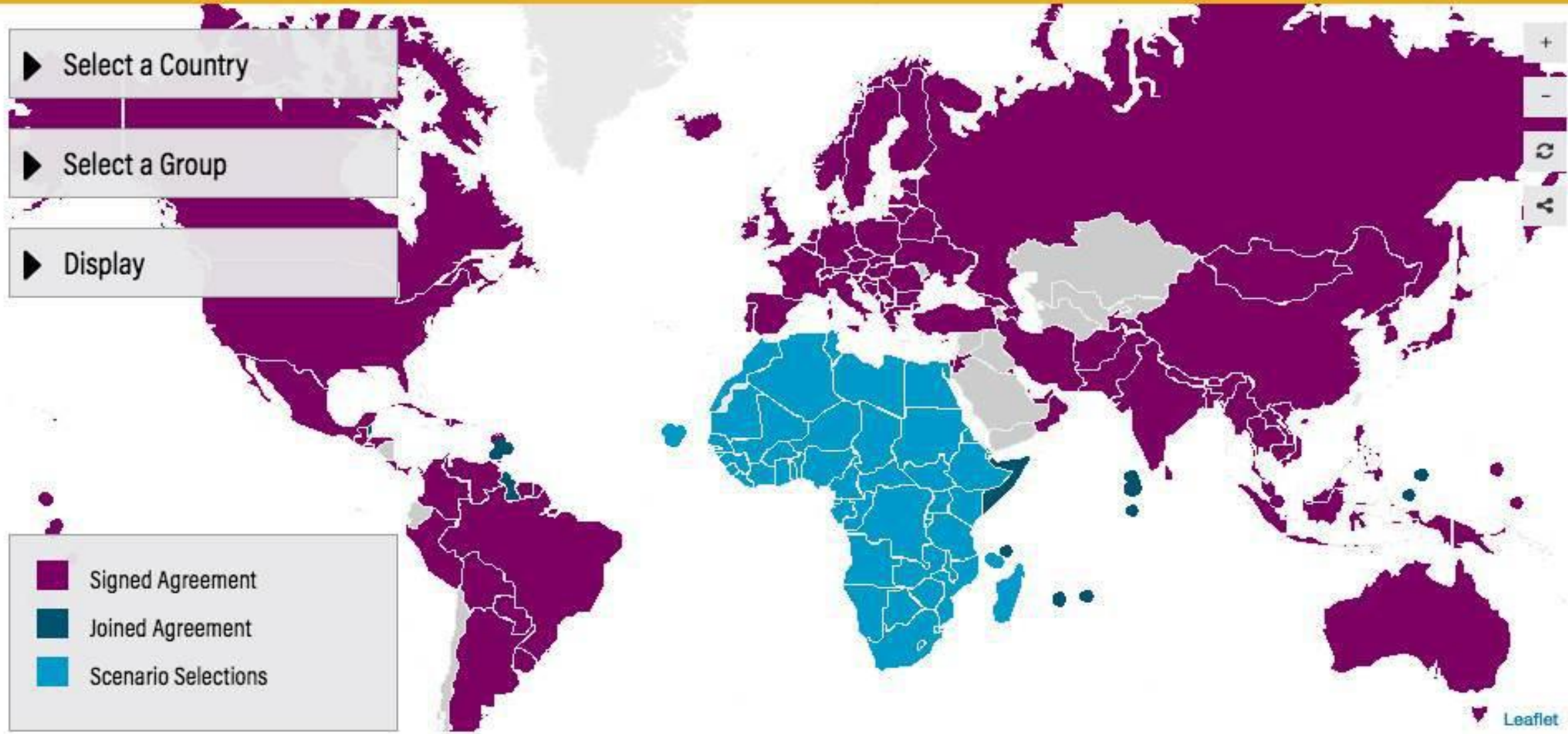


During the Paris climate conference, on December 2015, 125 countries adopted the first ever universal climate protection deal.

This agreement tries to create a global action plan to minimize climate change by limiting global warming to well below 2Co.

# When it comes to transparency and stock take :

Governments agreed to :

- come together every five years to set targets according to developments
- report on the progress of achieving their goals



# When it comes to adaptation :

Governments agreed to:

- help society to be able to deal with climate change
- provide continuous international support to developing countries



# Loss and Damage:

Governments agreed to:

- Recognize the loss and damage associated with climate change
- acknowledge the need to cooperate and understand action and support in different areas such as warning systems and risk insurance.



# Non-Party stakeholders:

For the non-party stakeholders (cities, other subnational authorities, civil society, the private sector, etc.) the agreement recognizes their role and invites them to:

- Contribute and support actions to reduce the gas emission
- Raise and promote regional or international awareness towards the climate change
- Adverse the effects of the climate change by reinforcing their defense and resilience.

# Support:

- The countries of the EU along with all the other developed countries will continue to support the actions of against climate change in an effort to restrain the emissions and decrease the vulnerability and sensitivity of the planet while contributing to the progress and activity of the developing countries.
