KOSTIS KARATHANASIS

THEODORE ROOSEVELT

- **NUMBER: 26TH PRESIDENT**
- **TERM:1901-1909**
- **PARTY AFFILIATION: REPUBLICAN PARTY**
- **BORN: OCTOBER 27, 1858**
- **DIED: JANUARY 6, 1919**



MILESTONES

DOMESTIC

- PROMOTED THE CONSERVATION MOVEMENT AND PLACED MILLIONS OF ACRES OF LAND UNDER FEDERAL PROTECTION TO PRESERVE AMERICA'S NATURAL RESOURCES.
- REGULATED RAILROAD RATES TO PROTECT THE MIDDLE AND WORKING CLASS.

FOREIGN

- SENT THE GREAT WHITE FLEET ON A TOUR TO DEMONSTRATE AMERICAN POWER.
- NEGOTIATED AN END TO THE RUSSO-JAPANESE WAR, FOR WHICH HE WON A NOBEL PRIZE.

WOODROW WILSON

- NUMBER: 28TH PRESIDENT
- TERM: 1913-1921
- PARTY AFFILIATION: DEMOCRATIC PARTY
- BORN: DECEMBER 28, 1856
- DIED: FEBRUARY 3, 1924

DOMESTIC

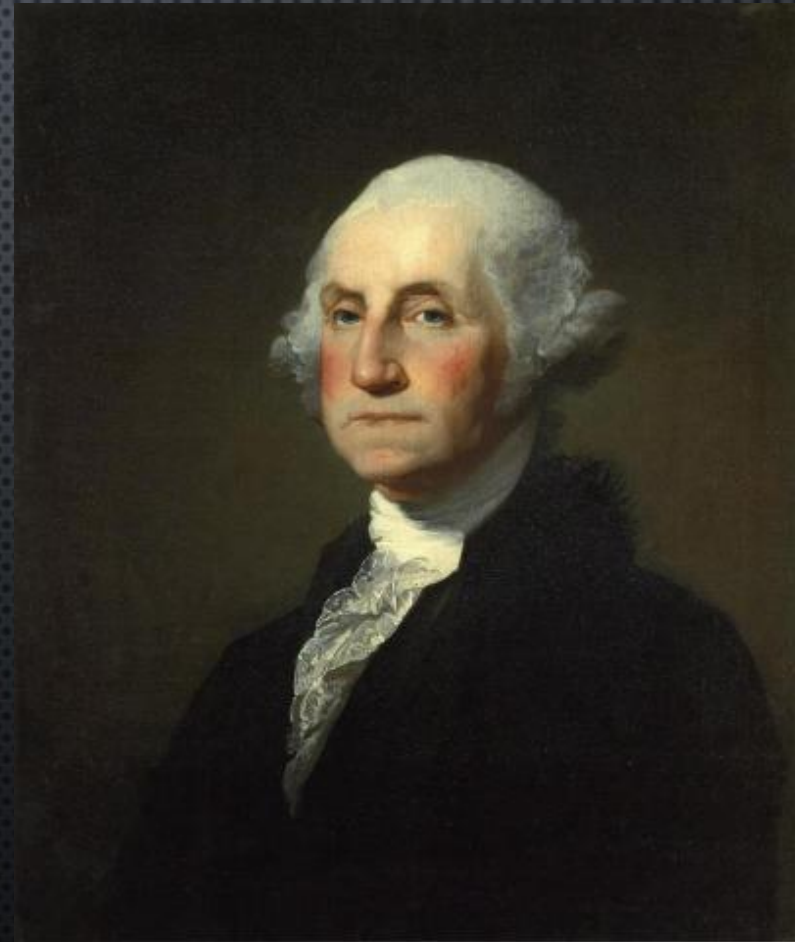
- BECAME A MAJOR ADVOCATE FOR WOMEN'S RIGHT TO VOTE.

FOREIGN

- LED THE US INTO WWI IN 1917.
- FREQUENTLY EXERCISED MILITARY FORCE IN LATIN AMERICA.

GEORGE WASHINGTON

- NUMBER: 1ST PRESIDENT
- TERM: 1789-1797
- BORN: FEBRUARY 22, 1732
- DIED: DECEMBER 14, 1799

DOMESTIC

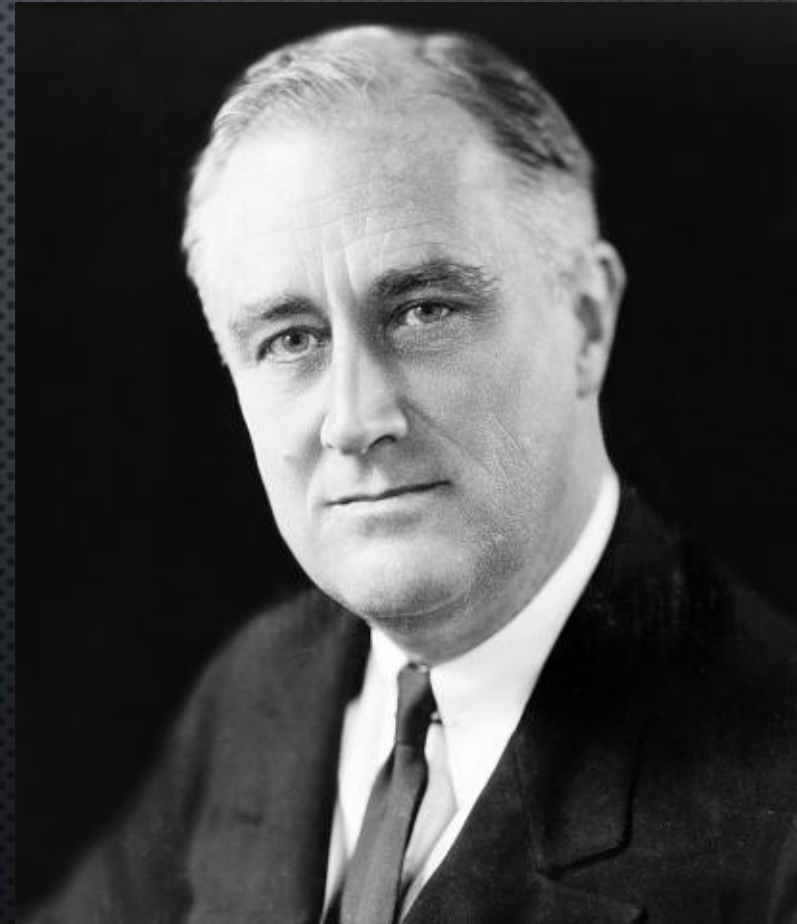
- WAS THE COMMANDER DURING THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR.
- MOBILIZED TROOPS AGAINST THE WHISKEY REBELLION (TAX PROTEST).

FOREIGN

- NEGOTIATED TRADE RELATIONS WITH BRITAIN.

FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT

- NUMBER: 32ND PRESIDENT
- TERM: 1933-1945
- PARTY AFFILIATION: DEMOCRATIC PARTY
- BORN: JANUARY 30, 1882
- DIED: APRIL 12, 1945



MILESTONES

DOMESTIC

- DRASTICALLY DECREASED UNEMPLOYMENT FROM 25% TO 2% OVER HIS TENURE.
- ESTABLISHED SOCIAL SECURITY, THE SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION (SEC), AND THE FEDERAL DEPOSIT INSURANCE CORPORATION (FDIC), ALL OF WHICH LAST TO THIS DAY.

FOREIGN

- DEVELOPED THE GOOD NEIGHBOR POLICY WITHDRAWING AMERICAN FORCES FROM LATIN AMERICAN COUNTRIES.
- LED THE US INTO WWII AFTER THE JAPANESE ATTACK AT PEARL HARBOR IN DECEMBER, 1941.
