Location

- They live in forests near water places where they find food to eat.



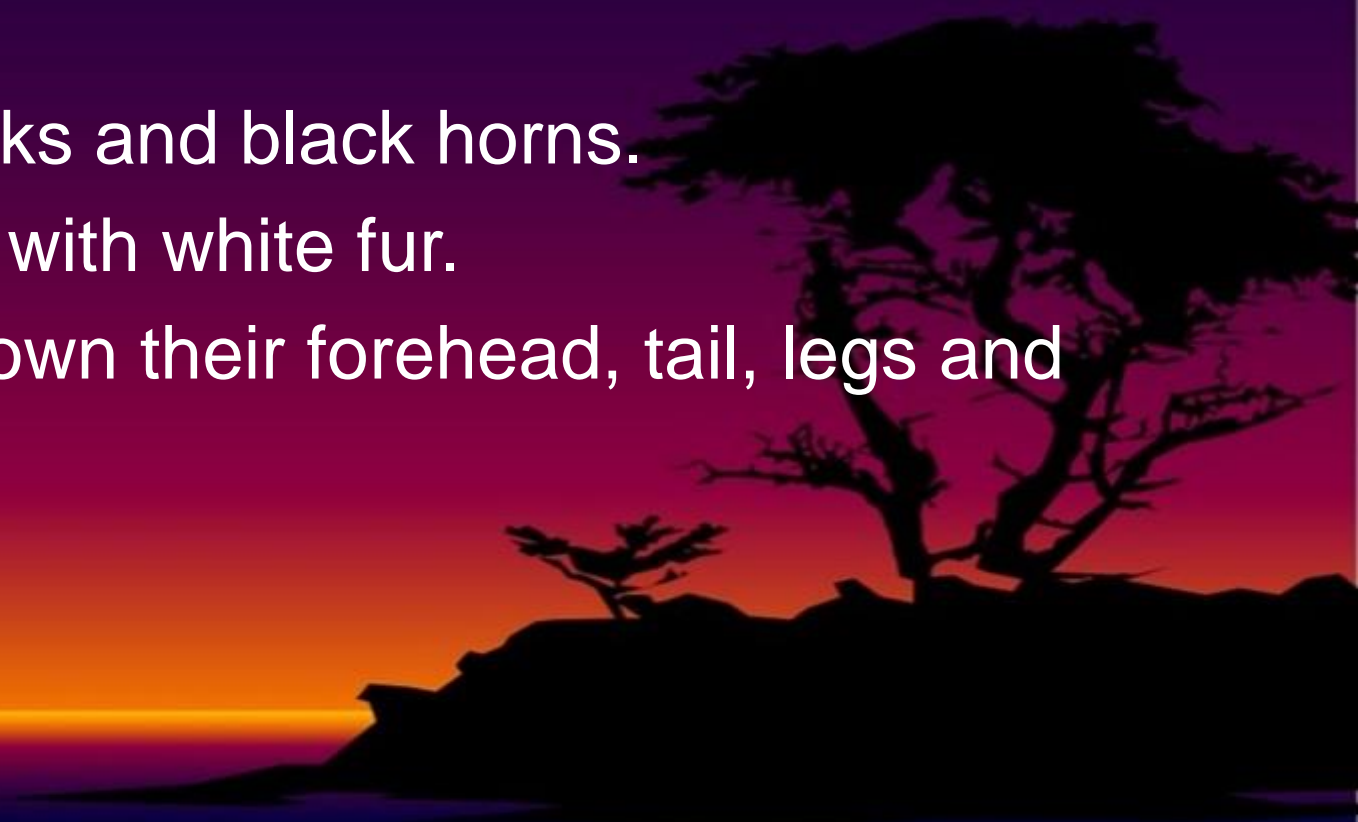
Food

- They are active in the early morning and right before sunset.
- They can jump up to 3 m.



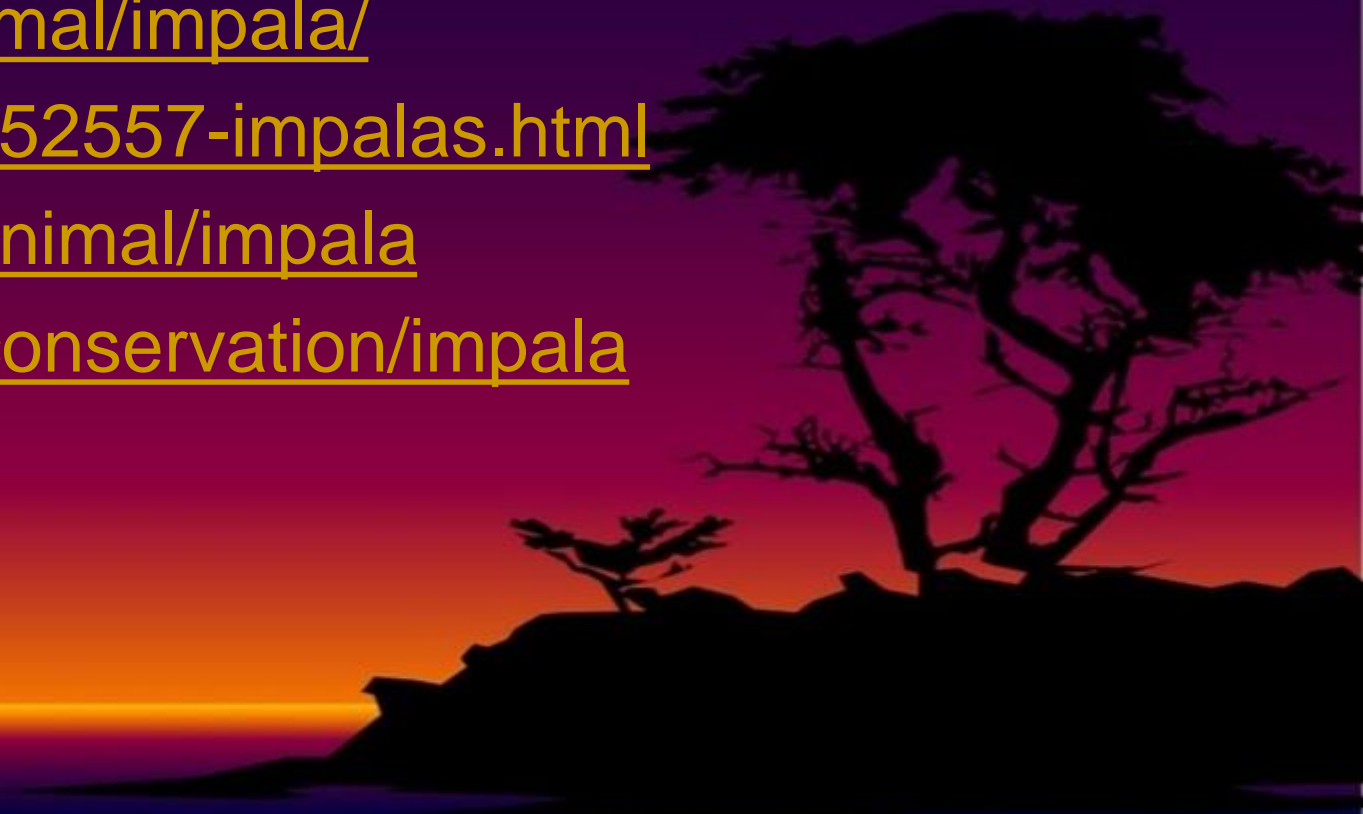
Interesting facts

- They can live up to 12 years old.
- Baby impalas are named 'calves'.
- The name 'Impala' means 'Gazelle' in Zulu language.
- They can run at 60 km per hour.
- The population is around 2 million.
